What is MAT?

Medication assisted treatment (MAT) is the use of medications, combined with counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a holistic approach to the treatment of substance use disorders.

What medications are used?

- Methadone- Opioid treatment • (Bismarck)
- Buprenorphine- Opioids
- Naltrexone- Opioids and alcohol
- Antabuse- Alcohol

How is Heartview MAT different?

Heartview's MAT program is fully integrated into our treatment program. Patients are required to attend treatment services in conjunction with medication

Residential Treatment:

Bismarck Dickinson Cando During residential treatment, clients attend group, individual treatment sessions, lectures, yoga, etc. Nursing staff monitors medications and withdrawal symptoms.

Outpatient Treatment:

Heartview develops individualized treatment plans in which clients may attend outpatient treatment daily, multiple days per week, ••• weekly, or as-needed.

Medication Assisted Treatment:

Medications may be used to ease withdrawal and sustain recovery. Heartview doctors prescribe medications for opioid, alcohol and nicotine withdrawal.
